As a member of Canon Frome CC you are expected to abide by the following junior code of conduct:

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit — a personal box, legguards and helmets for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.
- Members must pay annual subscriptions and fees for training or events promptly.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
- Bad language will not be tolerated.
- Any player disrupting coaching sessions will be asked to sit out. Parents will be informed if the disruption continues.
- All players must assist the coaches and managers by returning all club kit to the club bag after matches and training, before leaving the ground.
- Kit marked with Canon Frome CC is the property of the club. All balls must be returned after training.
- No hard balls are to be thrown around whilst people are arriving for or leaving from training sessions.
- It is the responsibility of all juniors/ parents to name & look after their own personal kit.
